

REACH, ROHS & CONFLICT MINERALS

Kyrel Oy is committed to responsible business operations and requires similar commitment from its suppliers. Likewise, Kyrel Oy is committed to using only materials from manufacturers selected by its Customers in the manufacture of Customers' products. This means that Kyrel Oy's responsibility for the content of the materials and their compliance with regulations is limited, and therefore the manufacturers' responsibility for choice cannot be transferred to Kyrel Oy.

As a contract manufacturer, Kyrel Oy does not select material manufacturers other than soldering agents and (possibly) for passive components (resistors and capacitors) and printed circuit boards.

We require our suppliers to comply with the REACH and RoHS legislation, as well as to actively assist in determining compliance with conflict minerals regulations.

REACH

The purpose of the REACH legislation is to protect human health and the environment from the harmful effects of chemicals and to require information on safety risks from manufacturers and importers of chemicals.

RoHS

As a basic assumption, Kyrel Oy only procures materials and components that comply with RoHS regulations. In some exceptional cases (spare parts and the like), the customer may have chosen non-RoHS materials for their products.

Kyrel requires its suppliers, with the exceptions mentioned above, to comply with RoHS regulations and to report on the RoHS status of the materials it supplies.

Conflict Minerals

In 2012, the United States Securities and Exchange Commission imposed legislation known as both the Dodd-Frank Act and the Conflict Minerals Rule, which obliges U.S.-listed companies to investigate if their products contain tantalum, tin, tungsten or gold (abbreviated 3TG) originating in the DRC, as well as a few others in legislation countries mentioned.

Kyrel Oy is not directly obliged to operate under the aforementioned legislation, nor does it directly acquire any of the aforementioned minerals. However, Kyrel Oy wants to be involved in the international commercial community in limiting the illegal and unethical acquisition of these minerals and the resulting armed financing. Since these minerals are used in the components acquired by Kyrel Oy, Kyrel Oy, for its part, undertakes to investigate and maintain the information related to these minerals in accordance with the CMRT model to the extent that the manufacturer has been selected by Kyrel Oy.
